



Boise State University is seeking a full time Director of Developmental Math and College Algebra. This is a twelve month administrative appointment with supervisory duties. The director will be charged with promoting student success in developmental math and college algebra courses and will be provided the opportunity to develop a vision and implement a plan for delivery of these courses. The Director will be responsible for developing curriculum, supervising the developmental mathematics instructors and support staff, and interacting with the larger campus community.

The position requires a Masters degree in mathematics or mathematics education, along with two years experience in a similar position, or a doctorate in mathematics, mathematics education or a related field. Successful teaching experience in developmental mathematics, supervisory experience, and experience with hybrid or other alternative course delivery mechanisms are also required. Familiarity with a university work environment and experience with assessment methods, especially data driven measures of student success and pedagogical methods are preferred.

The successful applicant will assume management of the Boise State Math Learning Center which currently offers approximately 70 sections of introductory and intermediate algebra each year using a hybrid model. Boise State University is the largest university in Idaho, with an enrollment of more than 19,500 students. The University is located in Idaho's capitol city and largest metropolitan area, which serves as the government, business, high-tech, economic, health care, and cultural center of the state. The city is convenient to outdoor recreation including world-class white water rivers, skiing, mountain biking, fishing, hunting and camping.
